The United States currency is Dollars and cents. Dollar notes are available in denominations of \$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100.

Coin denominations in common use today are the 25-cent, 10-cent, five-cent and one-cent pieces, familiarly known as the quarter, dime, nickel, and penny.
